PARISH WEBSITE Each day there is something new to read.

WEEKLY MESSAGE

Today's Gospel begins with the Pharisees plotting against Jesus. They ask Jesus if it is lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar. The Pharisees ask the question only because they hope to trap Jesus by his answer. However, Jesus is well aware that they only want to discredit him in the people's eyes. Jesus knew that regardless of how he answered the question, it would be wrong in the mind of the Pharisees. Thus he doesn't answer the question directly. He decides to take a different approach. He asks for the coin that typically was used for paying the census tax. Then he asks the Pharisees whose picture is on the coin. Naturally they reply that it is Caesar's picture. Then Jesus responds to their question. His statement is very concise: they should give to Caesar what belongs to him! But then Jesus adds a few simple but powerful words: "repay to God what belongs to God!"

Those who can remember the penny Catechism will recall the first questions "Who made you? Why did God make you? God did not create us and then walk away, disinterested in what happened to His creation. He is with us every moment of every day, hoping that we will engage with Him. Our very lives come from our loving God! As each day passes we see dreadful things on our TV screens: people responding with aggression and anger, people lost and hungry, people fearful of what lies ahead. We must pray for those who are trying to find a way to peace, for those who are trapped in a cycle of violence, for those who see only desperation. We ask that the Lord will enter their hearts and help them to see a way forward that leads to peace. God will show us the way, but we have to listen to His voice.

Lead us from death to life
from falsehood to truth
from despair to hope
from fear to trust.
Lead us from hate to love
from war to peace.
Let peace fill our hearts
let peace fill our world
let peace fill our universe.
