MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

Every year on the Third Sunday of Advent I remember a folk group of the 1970's 'Steeleye Span and in particular Maddy Prior who sang "All round my hat I will wear the green willow" and ... "Gaudete ..." For this Sunday is 'Gaudete Sunday, Joy Sunday"

Wherever you find Advent candles, this week instead of lighting a purple one we light a pink/rose coloured one. More of a 'happy' colour than the dour purple . As a child I remember the TV presenter Valarie Singleton making an Advent Wreath from two wire coat hangers from which she would light the Advent candles each week . I also remember them showing how candles were used on the feast of St Lucy to take away the darkness of the winter solstice (feast day of St Lucy is Tuesday 13th December) . A young girl would wear a crown of lighted candles and give thanks to God through prayer , song and dance about the importance of light over darkness Can't imagine this being allowed today through health and safety!

These are positive symbols of good over evil, light over darkness, hope and joy over melancholy and sorrow.

What wonderful words there are in this week's first reading from my friend Isaiah. . .

"'Let the wilderness and dry lands exult,

Let the wasteland rejoice and bloom

Let them rejoice and bloom.

Strengthen all weary hands

Steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts

'courage' do not be afraid, your God is coming. Be not afraid for He is coming to save us . . . ' "

This coming week, December 14th my old friend Peter Collins, Tredegar born, Rhymney bred, will be elevated to the episcopacy, Bishop of East Anglia. He might not wear a crown of candles like Lucy but he has been called to "wear" the light of hope, comfort and joy and take away the darkness, gloom and despondency of people's lives. He must make a home in his heart and mind the words of Isaiah to strengthen all weary hands and faint hearts and to recognise that the Lord is very near. He's also like all clergy who aim to have the courage, simplicity and humility of John the Baptist in the Gospel...

"Happy the man who does not lose faith in me as he's been sent to bring news to the poor and to bind up the broken hearted... of all children born, greater than John has never been seen. Yet even the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he . . . "
