WEEKLY MESSAGE

When Jesus originally told stories to people, he used ideas and images that would have been very familiar and recognizable to them. For example, when Jesus told these seed parables, he was speaking to people who were very familiar with farming. Even if they didn't farm themselves, they lived in and amongst farm fields. They knew how to tell when the grain was ripe, and what people did when it ripened. They also knew that no one would intentionally sow mustard seeds anywhere, because it grew everywhere.

Some years ago, some people decided to plant mustard seeds in the community garden near their Church in honour of this parable. They selected a corner apart from the other herbs and vegetables to sow their mustard seeds, not even knowing if they would sprout. Well, sprout they did, and the gardeners spent all summer fighting and wrestling the mustard to keep it from spreading beyond its allotted corner. It was with great relief that, in the autumn, they pulled up the old plants and tilled the garden under. But the next spring, before they had a chance to plant any new crops, the entire garden came up..... mustard!

In the First reading we hear about Cedar trees. Cedars are tall and noble, but they can be cut down. Mustard is hardly noble or tall, or looks anything special, but like dandelions or blackberry brambles, once it shows up, it's there to stay. That's what the kingdom of God is like. Around our Church is a very unruly hedge.. it grows so fast. But if you look closely, little birds seem to love it. They enjoy the protection of the twigs and leaves, and the fact that it is untidy does not seem to matter. It is a safe place to be. Perhaps it is like that for the mustard bushes.

We may not be able to explain everything Jesus says about seeds and the Kingdom of God but we don't have to. If we let it, the Kingdom of God takes root and grows in us, we know not how.

But every time we see mustard, or dandelions or brambles, or even our Church hedge, let them remind us that God's Kingdom is always there, growing unnoticed waiting for us to make room for it in our lives. Just let His Kingdom of justice, love and peace grow.



Lord Jesus,
