WEEKLY MESSAGE

How easy it is for us to pass judgement on someone or something. How easy it is to criticise and to share that criticism with others.

When we watch a crime drama on the television we often hear the question "did the victim have any enemies?" Most of us would probably say that we don't have any enemies and that hopefully we are unlikely to be perceived as an enemy to someone else. But in today's reading the word 'enemy' is used in a much wider context: to include those who treat us badly, and those whom we treat badly.

Years ago there was a favourite children's story book with several characters that resonate through time. There was Mrs Doas-you-would-be done-by and Mrs Be-done-by-as-you-did. In today's society often revenge is seen as the way to go, but in today's Gospel Jesus takes a completely different approach. He asks us to love our enemy and do good to those who treat us badly.

How can we be compassionate as God is compassionate? As for not judging and not condemning –finding a weakness in someone and then exploiting it mercilessly seems to be more the norm these days. Yet, Jesus preached the message of today's gospel because he believed it could be lived. He did not intend it only as a piece of moral teaching to be admired; he presented it as a way of life to be lived. This is the way of life of the heavenly man that Paul speaks about. We cannot live this way of life by ourselves. Only Christ can live this life in us. Our calling is to keep on growing in our relationship with Christ, allowing him to grow in us, so that he can live his life in and through us. When that happens, his voice will come to dominate our lives, and we will begin to speak with one voice, the voice of Christ. We will begin to take one path, the path of Christ, regardless of the situation in which we find ourselves, regardless of how people might be treating us.

Let us today listen for the voice of the Lord that is constantly speaking to us, guiding us and supporting us and to forsake the nagging voice of criticism and revenge, which tempt us away from the way of calm and peace.

Out of the gloom a voice said, " Smile and be happy, things could be worse" So I smiled and was happy and behold Things did get worse. But then I became aware of a hand holding mine And I turned and smiled once more. God was walking by my side.

Don't be so quick to judge, you never know when you might just find yourself walking in that person's shoes.
