MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

Temptation is alive and well, still wandering the earth, still tempting people. As that great Irish Man of letters Oscar Wilde once wrote..." I can resist everything except TEMPTATION..."

None of us can resist Temptation , not even me , your "Holy, Saintly and Innocent " Parish Priest! To be Tempted is to be Human and I my friend , I'm as human as the next person in the queue at Tesco or sitting next to you on the Bus from Grange Gardens into town. So you and I have a great deal in common .

I have a tendency to speak before putting my brain into gear, uttering words that should have remained unsaid. An example of this happened in the Cathedral at the Mass of St David when I swore and it was picked up on the microphone "...!.

During our Parish Mass on Ash Wednesday I talked about one of the many problems that I've carried over the years: the number of Boxes I have accumulated that remain unopened. The temptation is not to open them, keeping all the junk and unwanted and unnecessary items, locked away, hindering me from moving forward on my life's journey.

Look at it from a different standpoint: the Boxes are ourselves carrying guilt and remorse for past mistakes which do not allow Jesus an opportunity to empty the 'Boxes' so to heal and forgive us

"Turn away from Sin and be faithful to the Gospel"

Jesus in today's Gospel is tempted and we will be tempted today, tomorrow and the next day, so no matter who you are our Lenten Journey is an opportunity to find an understanding, to find the forgiving Jesus in the bottom of the box.

I'm NO plastic statue, but a man with feelings, emotions sometimes temperamental and melodramatic but can empathize with the tempted and the fallen. So this Lent let us move forward together, closer to our friend the TEMPTED JESUS.

'Lord our God, you formed man and woman from the clay of the earth and breathed into them the spirt of New Life.

In this time of Lent, a time of Repentance we call upon you to empty us from the things that stop us from coming closer to you.

Bring us closer to you and to a New Way of Living.

Raise up the fallen, give new strength to the tempted and a sense of Joy at this time,

Through the name of Christ Our Lord.
