#### MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

These past few weeks we've had total saturation of the forthcoming Coronation and more to come. The weekend papers will be full of articles both of the event and the many people who wish to share their story of the day and what the Royal Family means to them along with pictures of the King and Queen.

For centuries the Roman Catholic Community within these islands were looked upon with suspicion and distrust, traitors to the Crown. Many were put to death for their Faith during what I call "The Age of Intolerance" . . . 'You killed one of ours so we kill one of yours !'
