#### **MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE**

Everyone has their favourite TV programmes, mine are MASH and Endeavour, while others like the Great British Bake Off or the Great Pottery Throw Down, neither of these have I watched.

The viewer tunes in to watch the Baker or the Potter make a mistake and I expect the biggest mistake *they* make is appearing on these shows!

Potters mould and re-mould clay until they are satisfied, and much time and effort is put into creating an object of beauty.

The Pandemic has changed many things, changed peoples' attitudes and perspective on, for example the Church. God the Father is the 'Great Potter and we are the Clay'. Let us think about our own Archdiocese and how it has managed and manned, in particular our area of the Diocese. This weekend we have a collection for the Sick and Retired Clergy.

Most of these men have given service to God and His people for 50 years. When I started, there was no provision made for retirement, you worked until you died! Now, we are allowed to retire at 75 years. Please remember those who have retired and those about to retire. They need your help.

A great number of priests still in active ministry are getting older. I'm nearer 70 years than 60 years.

This is where the Re-moulding of the Parishes must and will take place.

If another priest dies or is taken ill or has to retire, there is NO ONE TO TAKE HIS PLACE --- there are no reserves, all the players are on the field.

What will our numbers be when St Patrick's re-opens fully, or any of the parishes in this part of South Wales? So this weekend, pray for those in active service, show your appreciation for the sick and retired by contributing to the collection as you come into Church and be open to the remoulding of our Parish Communities in the near future.

May the Word they proclaim give them courage and wisdom.


We pray for those members of the clergy who are not in the best of health that they may feel your healing touch.

# LIFE'S LIKE THAT!




Three preachers sat discussing the best positions for prayer while a telephone repairman worked nearby.
