MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

Have you ever been afraid? Have you ever felt let down by your friends? Have you ever felt like running away? I have. I've been afraid, let down by friends and felt like running away as the problems I was encountering felt too much to handle. May I also add that I have let my friends down.

After Jesus called His friends together to share the Passover Meal which became known as the Last Supper, that evening Jesus experienced fear, broken friendships and even felt like running away. Things were becoming too much for Him . The men He called to follow Him, Peter who denies his friendship with the Lord, Judas selling Him for a bag of coins whilst the others slowly ran away leaving Him in His hour of need. Does this sound familiar ? I see myself in Peter, Judas and the other Disciples .

In today's Gospel I picture myself as one who had a guilty conscience after running away from my friend when He needed me most . I ran away into the dark alleyways of Jerusalem fearful and with a guilty conscience. After finding I was not alone as the other friends of Jesus had done the same, we encouraged each other to meet once again in the Upper Room of The Last Supper for mutual support .

We are like the first followers of Christ in so many ways, that is why we are encouraged to meet in the "Upper Room" each week to Break Bread and gain mutual support, the Church, the Parish of St Pat's, the imperfect family of God .

My Ordination day is the Feast of Thomas, July 3rd. What an important role he has played in my Priestly life. For me his story gets played out so often, in the days when I encounter doubts, fear and uncertainty; the times I feel the answer to the problem is to close the door and find solace in escapism rather than seek help and encouragement from Jesus and my fellow "Travellers"

Thomas was there but did not believe that Jesus had met the others. Jesus came and stood amongst them.


