WEEKLY MESSAGE

Today we celebrate the Transfiguration of the Lord. Can you imagine the scene? Peter, James and John were probable totally unprepared for what happened. Here was someone they followed, they were in awe of, who puzzled them, who did the most amazing things and then suddenly on the top of the mountain showed them a glimpse of His Heavenly Majesty and the splendour of the Kingdom, which was waiting for them. What does this mean for us? The Apostles saw what we all hope to see at the end of our lives: the Glory of Heaven and a place for each of us.

In today's Gospel God reveals the gift He offers all of us. This gift is Jesus. So how can we be assured that there will be a place for us? All we need to do is to respond to the calling of the Lord, and walk faithfully in His ways. He asks that we "Listen to Him".

Listening to Jesus means that we transform our lives and change our ways. Sadly our default setting is 'Self' and so many of us are caught up in promoting ourselves, busying ourselves with the tasks of the day so much so that we forget to allow the Spirit of the Lord guide us in what we do.

Listening to Jesus means living according to the Word of God, walking with God, trusting in Him no matter what our circumstances, obeying His will and paying attention to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. It takes practice and determination.

In the week we heard of four men from Nigeria who risked everything for a better life. They were determined. The men stowed away on a container ship, not on deck but sitting in the space above the rudder of the enormous ship. The ship travelled 3,500 miles and they were there for 14 days. They ran out of food after 10 days but survived by drinking sea water that was crashing just metres below them. To prevent themselves from falling into the water, where there was the constant threat of sharks, the men rigged up a net around the rudder and tied themselves to it with a rope. The ship eventually stopped in Brazil and the men were safe. They risked everything for a chance at a new future.

Our future is there before us. We too have to make changes, to be transformed, to be determined, to leave behind the selfishness and the greed and secure ourselves to the Lord. His hand is always there to rescue us and to lead us to safety, to our place in the Heavenly Kingdom.

"In My Father's house are many rooms...
