WEEKLY MESSAGE

Today is the second Sunday of Advent. It's the day when we light the second candle on the Advent wreath—the Faith or Bethlehem Candle. How often have you heard it said that so many of us are selective in what we hear. We hear but we have difficulty in listening to what is being said. Listening requires more than just hearing spoken words.

In the distant past, listening and repeating was the order of the day. That is how messages and stories were passed on. If we are honest, a comment about our poor listening skills would be found in many school reports throughout the land. Any teacher will tell you that listening skills are getting poorer year on year. Today we hear about a Messenger, who had a very important message to pass on.

That Messenger is John the Baptist who was bringing a Message to the people of his time but sadly not everyone wanted to listen to his words, let alone act on them. If *you* wanted to pass a verbal message on, you would chose someone who could deliver it accurately. John the Baptist was one such person, chosen by God to be a very special Messenger indeed. He was a Herald, an announcer, a proclaimer. The message he had to deliver is of vital importance, and the voice of John the Baptist travels through time to us, here and now.

"This is the man who the prophet Isaiah spoke about,

'A voice cries in the wilderness, Prepare a way for the Lord ,

Make His paths straight . . . ' ''

The people of the time of Jesus would be very familiar with the prophecies of Isaiah, but even though they heard what was being said, listening and taking to heart is a different thing. For us this is where Faith begins. John is telling us that the Messiah is here, amongst us, if only we would listen and take heed, the World and We would change for the better

Dear Lord, you gave us the words of Scripture to guide us on our journey towards your Heavenly Kingdom. Help us to listen carefully, reflect on the words and rise to the challenges that are set before us. Help us to be still, because it is in the stillness that we can find our way to you, and help us to carry you throughout each day, knowing that you are always there in everything we do.
