Early analysis shows that at least 36 MPs supported the Bill but have concerns that mean they may vote NO at later stages. Just 28 MPs switching their stance to NO would ensure it is defeated at Third Reading. WEEKLY MESSAGE

This Sunday is Gaudete Sunday (pronounced gow-day-tay) and is the Latin word which means 'rejoice' Some people of a certain age may remember a song by the group Steeleye Span in the 1970's which made the charts with their song 'Gaudete'. It is a 16th Century Latin Carol. Google it ... it is worth a listen.

You will notice too that the priest is wearing rose vestments instead of deep purple ones, and the Third Candle on our Advent wreath is pink. This change of colour represents 'joy'.

Theologian Henri Nouwen described the difference between joy and happiness: while happiness depends on external conditions, joy is "the experience of knowing that you are unconditionally loved and that nothing — sickness, failure, emotional distress, oppression, war, or even death — can take that love away." Thus, joy can be present even amid sadness. In his Gaudete Sunday homily in 2014, Pope Francis said that on this "Sunday of joy" instead of fretting about all we still have to do to prepare for Christmas, we should think of all the good things life has given us. Being thankful and joyful is something many people find hard to do. The woes of everyday living seem to drown out everything else: worries and concerns, the never ending list of things to do, are often overwhelming and people saying to you 'cheer up' is not really helpful. Sometimes it is difficult to identify why we feel down or lacking in joy.

The joy Mary felt when the Angel gave her the news that she had been chosen to bear God's Son, must have filled her with a mixture of elation and terrifying fear. But Mary knew that what ever was ahead, God would be with her. The Shepherds too must have experienced terror when the Angels appeared to them, but this was replaced by a feeling of expectation, excitement and joy.

It is the same for us. God is with us, everywhere we go, in every breath we take. He us there with in our sadness and in our delights, and when we feel that life is not what we imagined it would be, He is waiting for us to grab His hand and help us experience the Joy of Heavenly Love.
