MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

This Sunday we enter into the fourth week of Advent leading to the Feast of Christmas on Saturday December 25th. What a journey it's been for us, and for Mary and Joseph! Both journeys have been arduous, full of twists and turns, exhausting and sometimes fearful. Since the start of 2020 we've been looking over our shoulders afraid that Coronavirus would catch us up and destroy us in body and soul, and now there is the new Omicron Variant for us to avoid. Stoically we plod on knowing that at some stage of our journey, the vaccines and the care we are taking will enable us to take a breath, hopefully without masks and restrictions.

Mary and Joseph had their gruelling journey. Most of the time it was demanding and challenging as they set out to Bethlehem. After many set -backs they arrived, afraid, not of Coronavirus, but of Herod. Many people of our time have lost their lives to the infection and two thousand years ago through the jealousy and resentfulness of Herod, the life of Jesus was at stake. The journey was physically demanding: treacherous tracks, fearful robbers, all in the heat of the mid-day Sun.

Our journey has brought us to the Crib, for today all roads lead to Bethlehem. Joseph, with the pregnant Mary, heard the encouraging words of the Angel and now the world rejoices at the Birth of the Saviour.

Humanity gives thanks for the gift of the Vaccine as we give thanks, honour and praise for Jesus.

So this Christmas let us with gratitude and deep appreciation continue our journey as did Mary, Joseph and Jesus.

These gifts are to be shared with all of God's Children, they are both life-enhancing for the whole world.

There have been times when I've not been the most genial travelling- companion but that part of the Journey is in the past. What is of importance is that is that we encounter the Great Gift of the Holy Family full of understanding and sensitivity and share it with each other. I'm proud to be a fellow traveller and with God's help will Journey with you into the New Year. Let St. Patrick's be a Parish alive with the word of the Angels
