WEEKLY MESSAGE

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. It is one of the most difficult and perplexing mysteries for us to even begin to understand. Many Theologians have tried, using complicated language, but this only serves to confuse people even more. St Patrick used a simple analogy: the Shamrock.

Saint Patrick, who lived in the Fifth Century was preaching to a large crowd of Irish people. Shamrock, which looks like clover, grows widely all over Ireland. According to legend, he picked some up to help the people understand a little of what he was saying about God. The shamrock has one stem but three lobes to each leaf and was in a way like the Trinity: that, in the one God there are three divine beings: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, but they are all One.

There are many analogies to help us to understand a little of the mystery of the Trinity. Another talks about a book, how a book has thickness, height and width. Together they make up the book. Another is an egg, how an egg has a shell, a yolk and the white part. Together they make up the egg.

The Nicene Creed, which we say at every Mass, clearly and simply defines each member of the Trinity: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.


It says of God the Father, that He is, "the Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible" God is the creator of everything and Lord over all the universe.

Of Jesus, it says, He is the only-begotten son of God—begotten, not made!—born of the Father before all ages, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God." He is equal to God the Father and of the same substance. God the Son refers to how we believe that God chose to come to earth as a human being in the form of Jesus, the son of Mary.

And lastly, of the Holy Spirit, the creed reads: "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son." These are beautiful words: Lord and giver of life. This refers to the power of God in our daily lives. What a way to understand the Holy Spirit!

I am no longer my own but yours. Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will; put me to doing, put me to suffering; let me be employed for you or laid aside for vou. exalted for you or brought low for you. Let me be full, let me be empty, let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things to your pleasure and disposal. And now, glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you are mine and I am yours. So be it. And the covenant made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen
