WEEKLY MESSAGE

Today we find Jesus and His disciples in a boat on the Sea of Galilee. Scholars tell us that the hull of a fishing boat recently discovered about 5 miles south of Capernaum, has been carbon dated to right around the time of Jesus, and it's likely that this was the kind of boat that Jesus and the disciples used on the Sea of Galilee. The boat that these scientists found measured 26½ feet long, 7½ feet wide, and, 4½ feet high, made of cedar and oak. It could hold about 15 people. It's evening, the sun is probably setting and there are other boats with them. After a long day of teaching and being with the crowds, Jesus and the disciples are no doubt looking forward to a quiet, undisturbed night.

The Sea of Galilee is situated below sea level, surrounded by hills and mountains, and the cool mountain air would often mix with warm sea air causing storms to arise on the sea very quickly. This is a big area of water, 13 miles long, 8 miles wide. So this isn't something that you could have an afternoon swim across. At some parts, the sea measures 140 feet deep and is considered to be a big body of inland water. This must have been a big, unusual storm, because many of the disciples, were seasoned fishermen. This is what they did for a living. This was their heritage. And here they are panicking. They had been in storms before but this storm felt different. The waves were crashing in, the boat filling with water, the dead of night, no light to guide their way, far from shore this is not a good situation. And, to make matters worse, the one person that they believe could really help them in this, seems oblivious to the whole thing, in fact 'He is 'asleep on a cushion!' It's hard to sleep in a boat, hard to sleep cramped up with 12 other men, hard to sleep during a thunderstorm, but Jesus managed to do all three things at the same time. Only once in the Gospels do we hear of Jesus sleeping and it is in the middle of a terrific thunderstorm, at sea.

"And He awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm." Jesus speaks a word and the storm ceases..

Then Jesus said to the disciples, "'Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?'"

The disciples had eyes, they had seen what He had done. But Jesus wanted them to know what He could do. Not just in the past, but in the present, and in the future.

There must have been times in our lives when we have been really afraid, when things have spiralled out of control, when disaster seems imminent. The Lord does not promise that He will suddenly make everything right, but what He does say is that He will be with us, giving us the strength to face whatever life throws at us, provided we trust Him. We all have ups and downs in our lives, times when we are fearful of the future, but the Lord is there too. In the now and in the future. Waiting for us to turn to Him and allow Him to guide us on the right path. The next minute is a new minute, tomorrow is a new day. Maybe we could embrace these new futures and place our hands in His, and allow Him to calm our fears and the storms in our lives.

Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid, do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.
