WEEKLY MESSAGE

This weekend we celebrate Fathers' Day, when we think about our dads, grandfathers, uncles, and all the men, living and deceased, who tirelessly and selflessly have given and give of themselves for their families with unconditional love.

It is a good time to also recall the exemplary role-model and patron saint of fathers – Saint Joseph – foster father of Jesus, husband of Our Lady and patron of the Universal Church.

St Joseph didn't ask to be a Dad.... he just stepped up to the plate when God asked him to, and he became the provider, the organiser and the protector of the most precious family of all. Like all Fathers he worried when things were difficult. He was frightened when he found out that the soldiers were determind to do baby Jesus harm; he worried when Jesus went missing, and no doubt there were other occasions when Jesus was a boy that caused him many a sleepless night. In the Gospels there are few references to him, but he is there in the background. When we have the stable scene, there he is, at the back, not the centre of attention at all. Saint Joseph certainly set the bar high for modern-day fathers, yet, by his very example, Joseph solidly demonstrates that it is quite possible to follow his example to be a righteous man by listening to, trusting in and obeying God's word.

Fathers often have a difficult time because it may be that they are the ones who stand in the distance. They are the ones who watch over their children even when their children are not aware of their concern. Fathers often look on, wanting to protect their children and yet knowing that they cannot grow into maturity unless they learn to struggle and to grow on their own. A father's love is often a silent love.... most often hushed and in the background.

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells us that the Kingdom of God is about planting mustard seeds, the tiniest of seeds, and watching them grow to become the largest of plants with branches so strong that the birds of the air can rest in them. A good father plants mustard seeds in the lives of his children. A father's patient and often overlooked love supplies to those planted seeds all the warmth and love that he can muster without hurting or impairing the growth of his children.

Let us be thankful for our fathers. May we never take them for granted. If you are fortunate enough to still have your father, take the time to thank him...today and every day. And if your father has passed on, spare some time to say a prayer for him.
