MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

This Sunday we enter into the fourth week of Advent leading to the Feast of Christmas on Sunday December 25th. What a journey it's been for us, and for Mary and Joseph. For them it would have been challenging enough, but for an expectant mother riding on a donkey on the roughest of pathways, the journey must have seemed endless. The way to Bethlehem was physically very demanding: treacherous tracks, fearful robbers, all in the heat of the mid-day Sun and very cold nights. After many set -backs they arrived, afraid, not of the imminent birth of the child but of Herod. Thank God they did not give up, even when they found they were without shelter.
