MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

How often have you sat as a family and played board games like 'Monopoly or Trivial Pursuit' or eaten a meal with members of your family? Sadly this often seems to be relegated the far distant past. Every time my sister and family appear, as the drink goes down, out come the board games, advisable to be played sober ! The Board Game is an extension of the meal. We've eaten and drunk, now the "Final Course".... Trivial Pursuit.

I've often asked the question "Which game is played most throughout the world?" I've no evidence, but I would say Snakes and Ladders: a game most people have played as children, as parents with their children or as grand parents. Quite a simple game to play and understand, even for me. You throw the dice, then move the counter along the board until you've reached the final square. From square 1 until square 100 you encounter ladders which assist the player to move up and onwards towards the finish. But then there are snakes !The snakes sadly are unavoidable which hold you back from finishing before anyone else. Down you go !
