

#### **WEEKLY MESSAGE**

Today is Laetare Sunday, the Fourth Sunday in Lent. The term is derived from the opening words of the Latin Mass, "Rejoice (Laetare) Jerusalem" The church is called to joyful anticipation of the victory to be won. This joyful theme provides a brief respite from the penitential emphasis of Lent.

King Henry V famously encouraged his troops with a powerful speech before the Battle of Agincourt, urging them to fight for glory and remember that day as a time of great honour, famously stating "Once more unto the breach, dear friends, once more". In a way we are all in a battle: a battle against our own inclinations to only think of 'self' and what we can gain for our ourselves.

The saying "what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, but loses his own soul" (Mark 8:36) is a powerful reminder that worldly success and possessions are ultimately meaningless if they come at the cost of one's spiritual well-being and relationship with God.

Last week the message was all about relationships and what we can do when we are in conflict with those around us. It was also about what we can do when we have stepped off the path the Lord has laid out for us.

To make amends with our family, friends and colleagues is often difficult to do: what if our apologies are rebuffed? What if those people harbour the time of disagreement? What do we say? What if we harbour that time and let it fester in our hearts and even though apologies are made the memories still linger.

With God, we have no such worries. God is always waiting for us to turn to Him and tell Him our worries, the times when we have made the wrong choices and gone against His wishes, the times when we have deliberately upset others and made no effort to put things right. If we are truly sorry for the wrong things we have done He will give us the strength to start again... no recriminations, no holding things against us. All Gone!

You have a chance to do this on Friday April 11<sup>th</sup> after the Stations of the Cross which begin at 4.00pm. Make a note in your diary. If you are unsure about the words to use in the Sacrament of Reconciliation please take a sheet to refresh your memory. The Penitential Service Friday 11<sup>th</sup> April 4.45pm till about 6.30pm
