- Teenagers' pilgrimage to Rome & Assisi – 24th-27th April 2025:

An exciting opportunity for young people aged 12-17 to participate in a pilgrimage to Rome and Assisi for the Canonisation of Bl Carlo Acutis. We hope that representatives from across the Archdiocese can be invited from amongst our deaneries.

The group will depart from Heathrow on April 24th and return on April 27th, with the following key highlights:

- The Holy Doors of the four Papal basilicas in Rome;
- Basilicas of St Francis, St Clare, & St Mary of the Angels in Assisi;
- Veneration of the relics of Bl. Carlo Acutis;
- Mass with the Holy Father for the Canonisation of Bl. Carlo Acutis

FINAL DOCUMENT OF THE XVI ORDINARY GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE SYNOD OF BISHOPS

The Final Document of the Synod has now been published and is available on the Synod website: https://www.synod.va/en/news/final-document-of-the-xvi-assembly.html. In approving this *Document*, the Holy Father said 'The local Churches and groupings of Churches are now called upon to implement, in their different contexts, the authoritative proposals contained in the *Document* through the processes of discernment and decision-making provided for by law and the *Document* itself'.

One of the ways we have been seeking to implement the synodal pathway is through the re-invigoration of Deanery Pastoral Councils. We are moving closer to establishing these, and I thank all those involved in the process of doing so.
