MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

We hear today of Jesus sending out His Disciples in pairs to preach the Gospel of Good News . Nothing has change in Two Thousand Years "The harvest is rich but the labourers are few. So ask the Lord of the harvest to send more labourers " There is plenty of work that needs carrying out but very few labourers willing to volunteer their time to the Lord's work. Certain parts of the world are in a desperate state, whilst others have no problem in nurturing and producing vocations.

I have seen at first hand the problems facing this Archdiocese as I travel round South Wales carrying and sowing the word of God . The days of one parish containing two or three clergy have gone. It has become a reality that one man is now looking after two or three parishes . There are many without a resident priest thus people like me are sent like the first Disciples . . .

"Start off now, but remember I am sending you out now like lambs among wolves."

Generosity of Spirit needs to be shown by both clergy and people . The priest goes in order for a particular community to be both encouraged in the Faith and to break the word of God and the Bread of Life, food for the journey.

Priests are there to serve and go where they are needed. They are Ordained for the Church not a Parish, thus the Archbishop sends people like me but there are always people who question "Their Priest" saying Mass outside his parish . You've heard me say " We can't have the Church on OUR terms "We must learn to share with those less fortunate than our selves . I would love to remain in one place each week not rushing into the Valleys leaving at the crack of dawn but the words of last weeks Gospel are ringing in my ears

"Jesus spoke to the man, 'Once the hand is laid to the plough, no one who looks back is fit for the kingdom of God'"

The problem we are facing starts and ends within every parish. Vocations come from parishes like St Pat's, ordinary people from ordinary families are called to take on extraordinary things like service to God through service to one's neighbour. Do you ever pray or encourage or get people even to consider that the Lord might be calling them?

I have often said that you the good people of Grangetown are my family. You've given me a home and an opportunity to grow and flourish, even to make mistakes but are always ready to forgive and encourage, that's what family life is all about.

Last week we celebrated my sister's birthday and our new Archbishop Mark O'Toole's on the same day June 22nd. On that day the church remembered St John Fisher and St Thomas Moore . As Moore faced the people before his execution he said " I die the King's man but God's man first "

To paraphrase these words I could say " I am a St Pat's Boy but the Church's man first " Your priest and proud St Pat's Boy, Michael Patrick
