WEEKLY MESSAGE

Today we hear another of the Pharisees tests. Even though their previous verbal traps had not gone well, they still ploughed on. Gathering around Jesus, one of the scholars of the law asked Jesus: "What is the greatest commandment in the law?" Naturally, Jesus replied: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind." Jesus also affirmed that this commandment was the first and the greatest of all the commandments. Then he continued and said: "The second commandment is similar: You shall love your neighbour as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." This second commandment was probably not what they wanted to hear.

Today Jesus is asking us to love God wholeheartedly. God should be first and foremost in our lives. However, Jesus also tells us to "love our neighbour as we love ourselves." Both commandments are challenging. However, the instruction to love our neighbour as we love ourselves we may find more challenging than the first commandment! This second commandment often stretches us in uncomfortable ways. First of all, who is our neighbour? It is not just the person who lives next door to us. In this context it is anyone with whom we come into contact. It is easy to love people who love us or who we like, but what if it is someone we do not like, or someone who may have wounded us, insulted us or ignored us? The emotion we experience with this individual most likely is far from being 'loving.'

Yet, Jesus calls us to love each and every person we encounter: the ones we like as well as those we prefer to keep our distance from. Often we have to fight against the instinct to lash out if we have been hurt in some way, maybe to seek revenge. Getting our own back is not what Jesus is asking us to do. It is not the 2nd commandment. Today let us strive to keep Jesus' call in our minds and hearts. Let us consciously strive to love each and every person we encounter, no matter how we feel about them. Who knows: we may encounter someone who consciously may be striving to love us!
