WEEKLY MESSAGE

Last Wednesday, we all had the opportunity to receive Ashes and this day heralded the beginning of the Season of Lent. Just as we set aside time to prepare spiritually for Christmas Day, it makes sense to set aside time to prepare for the Resurrection of the Lord at Easter.

Lent is a time that offers us an opportunity to look closely at our lives, how we behave and how much kindness and love we show to God and to others. It is also a time to open the doors of our hearts a little wider and understand Our Lord a little deeper, so that when Good Friday and eventually Easter comes, they are not just days when we come to church but an opportunity to receive the overflowing of Grace that God has to offer.

How often have we heard the question... "What are you giving up for Lent?"

Many people choose to give up chocolate or sweets or deny themselves something they enjoy. But what about giving up saying unkind things, or gossiping, or being bitter, or spending hours upon hours on social media? What about turning it around and instead of saying something unkind, say something nice. Instead of buying a treat for yourself buy something for someone else with no expectation of reward.

Our journey of life is very much like 'snakes and ladders' We have good days when things are going well and there are days when the world seems to be against us. For Jesus, He too had days just like those, but His journey of life ended with the path to His Crucifixion. Around our Church, we can see images of this last journey of the Lord, retold in fourteen stations. A station is a place where you wait for something, a place of expectation, a stopping place. Every Friday at 3.00pm during Lent, in our Church, we will re-tell this last journey of the Lord. We will stop at each image for a short while and we will think about what is happening and its significance for us. It is an opportunity for us in a small way to try to understand what Jesus did for us. It takes only a few minutes from our day, but it is a chance for us to close out our busy world and focus on someone else, someone who made the ultimate sacrifice for us. Please try to join us.
