Attendance & Punctuality

Please ensure your child is in class ready to begin learning at 8:55 a.m.

For all the children to gain the greatest benefit from their education it is vital that they attend regularly and be at school **on time** every day the school is open, unless the reason is unavoidable. Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their learning.

Unauthorised absences are those which the school and the Governing Body, following Government guidelines, do not consider reasonable and for which no 'leave' has been given. This type of absence can lead to the Local Authority (Educational Welfare Service) using sanctions and / or legal proceedings including penalty notices and fines. Unauthorised absence includes:

- Pupils persistently arriving late to school i.e. more than 10 sessions per half term
- Parents / carers keeping children off school unnecessarily e.g. because they had a late night or for non-infectious illness or injury that would not affect their ability to learn
- Absences which have never been properly explained
- Shopping trips
- Looking after other children or children accompanying siblings or parents to medical appointments
- Their own or family birthdays
- Day trips
- Holidays in term time

We never take such action lightly and would far rather work with parents/carers to improve attendance without having to resort to enforcement action. Attendance is regarded as highly important and we will use our powers if this is found to be the only way of getting a child to attend school.





We had our Innovation Day where we were introduced to our new topic- Our Super Selves. We took part in a sense scavenger hunt, different challenges and learnt about our body parts.















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

#### **Top Tips for Parents and Carers**

Teach Your Child About Online Privacy Help children understand the importance of keeping personal information private.

Children may not realize the dangers of oversharing online. Teach them to never give out personal details such as their full name, address, phone number, or school name to anyone online, especially on social media or gaming platforms. Explain that even if someone seems friendly, they could have bad intentions. Help them understand that once information is posted online, it can be very difficult to erase. Encourage them to use nicknames or avatars instead of real names when playing games or joining online communities.

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

Working alongside a range of support services and professionals, it ensures that families of children and young people with disabilities or additional needs are kept up to date with information that is both relevant and beneficial to them. In addition, it assists the planning and coordination of services supporting those children, young people and their families.

You can sign up to The Index if you are:

- A parent / carer of a child or young person aged 0 25 years with disabilities or additional needs resident in Cardiff
- A professional working with children and young people 0 25 years with disabilities or additional needs

To be included on The Index the child or young person must:

•

- be aged up to 25 years
- have a diagnosed disability, be in the process of diagnosis or have confirmed ongoing additional needs
