MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

I've always said that November is a very Catholic month. A time we remember and pray for those "Whose life is changed not ended". We believe they have gone before us and one day we will be re-united in the Great Banquet of Heaven.

Many people have asked me "What is it like to die? What and where is Heaven? Will we meet Our Lord once again?" Questions I can't answer as I've not died! You may ask 1) Do you believe this? 2) Why do you believe it? I suppose the simple answer is Faith and Trust. Faith and Trust in the words of Jesus

"I am the Resurrection and the Life. Anyone who believes in Me will have eternal life.

For today you will be with Me in Paradise."

This week Tuesday is 1st November, and is the Feast of All Saints, followed on 2nd November by the Feast of All Souls. Hopefully you will be able to join me on those days, but if you are unable to come to Mass you can unite yourselves with the Holy Souls in silent prayer.

When I visit the family graves in Neath, I have this urge to physically hold my parents and other family members and friends, but though I can't, I feel I'm at one with them and they with me.

I "walk in the presence of the family of the Lord in the Land of the Living", not in the Land of the Dead, the land of no hope, but the Land of the Living on the other side of the Promised Land



" Guide me O thou Great Redeemer Pilgrim through this barren land. I am weak, but thou art mighty, Hold me with your powerful hand.

When I tread the verge of Jordan, Land me safe on Canaan's side."



At most funerals, my Father gets a mention, so I'll mention him again today. When I officiated at his Funeral Mass, as he was a bus conductor, I said "Dad was on an early bus, but I'll be on a later one. The problem being I don't know the timetable." You and I know that one day that bus will arrive. For those who have no Faith it's a Mystery Tour, but for us, it's a journey to the Land of Canaan -- the Promised Land.

I'll let you into a secret: as a land owner of a plot of land in Neath Cemetery, my place of rest is my waiting room, awaiting the return of the Risen Lord at the last day. My Mother and Father are there and I've decided to put only two words on the grave stone

"And Michael" PS. Maybe a little red bus on the bottom.
