### MESSAGE FROM CANON MIKE

Last weekend I celebrated 40yr of Priesthood 39 more years than what the Rector and Archbishop Murphy thought I would achieve . . . . I'm still here, ready, willing and able to carry on serving the Lord through His Church . Many times I've sat thinking , " What has the Lord planned for me?" no good pondering trying to understand the mind of the Lord let alone the mind of the new Archbishop!

I've also sat and thought about the past, of the good and bad times which have had me both crying and smiling. Again a waste of time because the past is a foreign country.

What the Lord is asking of me is to live in the present, to serve and love Him through my neighbour . . . . . "A lawyer asked Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life, Jesus spoke to him tenderly,

' You must love the Lord your God with all your heart mind and soul and your neighbour as yourself'

These words come from today's Gospel and if we continue, we hear Him tell the story of The Good Samaritan, a story which people throughout the world have both heard and lived either as a person of indifference, walked on, leaving another person in need, been a victim of cruelty and abuse or being "The Good Samaritan" stopping to help another person in trouble. Which one are you?

During my life I've played all three roles and I wish to share one of each which occurred during my time as a Priest . Let me start as Michael the victim . It happened early one evening when two people tried intimidating me to hand over cash which I had taken from a cash machine. From verbal to physical. No one came to my aid. Those around me, nicely dressed, going about their business walked on trying NOT TO NOTICE . The "Good Samaritan" came in the shape of a "Rough Sleeper" who scared off my assailants then picked me up and offered to buy me a coffee .

The second story shows me in a bad light. I did not show anger or force to another person but turned away when asked for help in St Mary's Street in Cardiff . I've told you the story of the woman from a doorway shouting at me for not only failing to give her money but ignoring her as though she did not exist .

The third story is the hardest to tell . It involves doing good. Me performing an act of charity... Michael Evans the Good Samaritan! Is it false modesty that we don't wish to talk about the kind acts of charity which we have all performed throughout the course of our lives? I like talking about my old friend Veronica who we hear about helping the man Jesus on His Way to the Cross . When she opened her front door and saw this man carrying a burden she realised she was incapable of taking the cross away. She had the choice of slamming the door shut ignoring his plight or doing something . What she did was a simple act of charity. She took a cleaning rag and walked towards him offering in word and deed comfort to this person . That's what we are called to do each day of our lives to use the gift of speech to encourage and make a simple gesture of love and respect to others with a hug or something similar . So yes , I have performed "Acts of Charity"

So as I move forward as a Priest, I have come to recognise my faults and failings but also recognise my many gifts and talents which I Thank God for. I know I'm a different man to what I was when the Archbishop ordained me 40yrs ago . I have physically, emotionally and spiritually changed over the years but still need the gentle touch and encouraging word of Jesus. I must change often: be reshaped daily into the image of Jesus of the Beatitudes and filled with the Spirit of Understanding, becoming aware of other people's needs, being able to hear the cry of the Helpless and being the Voice of the Voiceless, topped off with a Big Dollop of Humour. So let's walk, pray and encourage each other as I head to my 50th.
