WEEKLY MESSAGE

When we were young, many of us were fearful of all sorts of things: strange sounds in the night, shadows, being lost. Some of us may have tried to hide from our fears, hiding under the 'blanket'. It was there we felt safe and secure, nobody could harm us. As we get older other 'fears' manifest themselves: being alone, being insecure for all manner of reasons. The 'blanket' doesn't have the calming influence that it once did.

Since the Dawn of time, men and women have shown fear, and some say that the best way to conquer it is to face it. Easier said than done! This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday, the Birth of the Church. The Disciples of Jesus were fearful, afraid of proclaiming that they were followers of the Lord as this would likely mean death. They sought security in each other's company, unsure of what to do next..... locked in the Upper Room. They had given up on Jesus as they thought He had given up on them. They came together for mutual support, to reinforce each other's doubting faith. They came together, entering the room as lambs entering a sheepfold, not sure of what would happen, hesitant, uncertain of the future.

But, the Lord had not abandoned them. He sent the Spirit, the Holy Spirit into their hearts, removing the fear, granting them power, strength and direction, enabling them to leave the room and to face the future, conquering the unbelieving world. This coming of the Holy Spirit is Pentecost and is the Birthday of the Church, the start of its Mission, which we must carry on.

The Holy Spirit is within us all, giving us the strength to chose the right path, to share with others the message of the Lord by how we behave, by how we show love to others. The Lord told the disciples as He tells us today, that the Holy Spirit will be our guide.

Some of us might remember learning about the Gifts and the Fruits of the Holy Spirit, when we were in school. But in case you need a reminder, here they are: (Fruits) charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity (Gifts) wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. All these, we have. If we all used all of these gifts and fruits what a wonderful place our world would be.

Spirit of God in the clear running water, blowing to greatness the trees on the hill. Spirit of God in the finger of morning, fill the earth, bring it to birth and blow where You will. Blow, blow, blow till I be but breath of the Spirit blowing me.

Because He lives, I can face tomorrow, Because He lives, all fear is gone; Because I know He holds the future, And life is worth the living, Just because He lives! Come and join us in our café for a cuppa and a chat after the 10.00am Mass on Sunday.
