### **WEEKLY MESSAGE**

Some years ago a survey was carried out among 'practicing' Catholics regarding their belief that when they receive Holy Communion they are in fact receiving the body of Christ in the form of bread. The results of the survey were shocking. Over two thirds of the people asked said that they believed that Holy Communion just was a reminder of the Body of the Lord. They did not believe that at the Consecration through Transubstantiation, the hosts of bread would be transformed into the body of Christ.

The belief that we are receiving the true Body and Blood of the Lord is fundamental to our Faith as Catholics.

For centuries scientists have worked on their theories about what constitutes 'life'. At this very moment the scientific community are analysing data collected from the surface of the Moon and scans on Mars to see if there is any evidence of life or if there has ever been life in these places. Nearer to home scientists have recently discovered life deep in the ocean where previously they thought no life could exist at all.

When we are created God gives us life and most of us are given choices about how we live that life. Can we point to a place in ourselves where life is? Can we say where happiness is, or anger or sadness? These are intangible things. When Jesus said at the Last Supper "This is My Body and This is my Blood" He meant just that. At the moment of Consecration God bestows on the hosts of bread and the wine the Life of the Lord. Can we understand this? No. Can we see a physical change? No. As Catholics must we believe this, YES!

There may be times when we are in the Holy Communion Procession when we do not appreciate the true enormity of what we are about to receive. The Lord will come to us individually, but it is not as though the food is assimilated into us but rather we become assimilated to the food.

Some people have asked why there is a light by the side of the Tabernacle. This light shines 24/7 and shows that the Consecrated Hosts that were not consumed by the people are inside this Holy place. The light shows the presence of the Lord. May this light shine in all our hearts as we develop our own understanding of what we receive when we come forward for Holy Communion.

Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul will be healed.

Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world.

He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."
