## WEEKLY MESSAGE

Every day we are faced with choices: where to go, what to eat, who to meet, but also choices about how we behave to one another: whether we are kind, angry, impatient, loving, tolerant..... the lists are endless. In the Gospels we hear Jesus saying "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' These two commandments are life instructions. Then recently we heard Jesus giving His listeners the Beatitudes which give us guidance for living. Life is never easy. In the time of Jesus and in the years that followed, His disciples faced persecution and even death. Even just admitting that you were a follower of the Lord was a dangerous thing to do. It would have been easy to deny the Lord. In fact, the Lord Himself was tempted, tempted to give up on His mission, to take the easy path.


These days we face a whole raft of different challenges when it comes to doing what it right. In today's Gospel we hear about Satan and evil and again it is easy to dismiss temptation as something from the past, not relevant to each of us today. But in fact evil and temptation surround us from the moment we wake up. We are back to choices. How often have we said (or written something in a text) that we know will cause hurt or distress, or let our tempers get the better of us. Loving others as much as we love ourselves is a hard thing to do. These days we are surrounded by images that promote 'self' as all important and that striving to be better than the next person is the way to go. These ideas do not match up with the Way of the Lord. Quietly knowing that we have made the wrong choice is one thing, admitting it and facing it head on is another.

Some months ago we had a penitential service -- an opportunity to come to the Lord and say out loud when we have made the wrong choices and sincerely say we are sorry, that we will try to do better and ask the Lord for forgiveness when we have fallen short of the commands He has given us.

When we have upset someone it takes courage to try to put things right. But it is the right thing to do. It is also the right thing to ask the Lord for forgiveness when we have allowed Satan to inveigle his way into our lives and tempt us along the wrong path. This path may be flat and easy but it does not lead to the happiness that Lord wants us to have.

After any Mass is an opportunity to seek the forgiveness of the Lord so that He may bestow graces upon us which in turn will help us with ..... our choices.

Lord, I need your wisdom for all the decisions I have to make each day. Help me not just to look within at my own instincts but to seek your wisdom that comes from above, to follow the example of Jesus' wisdom and to be guided by the Holy Spirit, who gives me wisdom in my heart.
