WEEKLY MESSAGE

Today for the First time the boys and girls, your sons and daughters, will meet Jesus for the first time in the Eucharist. They have been preparing for a long time, in fact since they day they were baptised. But in recent months they have met together, prayer together, worked together, walked together as they have come to learn about the Lord Jesus. It will be an encounter with the Lord. The Lord who loves them. The Lord who has a job for them to do: to spread the Good News. When they receive the Lord in the Eucharist, when they receive Him in Holy Communion, when they hear the words "The Body of Christ", they receive Jesus, Jesus truly present, Jesus here with us.

And how do we know this? Because Jesus told us Himself. At the Last Supper with His Apostles, He gave them this instruction, "Take this and eat it, for this is my body. Do this in memory of me"

Jesus comes to us - so that we can go from here, nourished, strengthened and fed. Fed at the Table of plenty - where God provides for all who believe. - Here, at the Table of plenty. That is what we believe.

Dear Parents please encourage your children in their faith, don't let their First Communion be their last. Make it your task to help your Sons and Daughters to grow in the practice of their faith, bring them to Mass, join with them, and most of all encourage them. Help them to appreciate this wonderful gift they have received, the Gift of Faith. Trust in God.

When the Apostles on that Road to Emmaus, recognised and knew it was Jesus, they were so happy, so excited that they ran all the way back to Jerusalem to tell the other Apostles. Today we should be full of Joy, as we welcome Jesus into our hearts and into our lives and receive Him in Holy Communion. In fact every time we receive Communion, we should rejoice, and give thanks. It is the greatest gift that God has given us, the gift of Jesus His Son, who gave Himself for us and who left us this precious, wondrous gift of the Most Holy Eucharist. This is what we believe, that is why when we receive Jesus and we hear those words, "The Body of Christ". Our hearts should rejoice, as we say AMEN.

On this the Feast of the Body and Blood of the Lord, let us pray for these our wonderful children, and ask the Lord to bless them as they walk the road with Him, as they come to know Him, as they worship and adore Him, and most of all as they make that commitment to Him today to come and gather each week in His name and receive Him in the Eucharist.

This is the day the Lord has made, let us be Glad and rejoice Alleluia!
